





What is Community Banking?

Community Bank BDCU is part of Bendigo and Adelaide Bank Limited's (BEN) Community Bank model, enabled through a Community Banking Franchise Agreement between BDCU Financial Services Pty Limited and BEN.

Community Banking is based on a 'profit-with-purpose' model, and over the last 25 years Community Bank companies have collectively reinvested more than \$320 million of profits back into Australian communities, across a wide range of social impact, infrastructure and community projects.

The Community Bank model enhances the capacity for Community Bank BDCU to deliver economic and social benefits to the Highlands and Tablelands.

Scam Awareness and Banking Safely Online

Together BDCU The Collective Impact and Community Bank BDCU are driven to support the digital literacy of our community by ensuring our community has the confidence to navigate the internet and safely use everyday technology.

According to Scamwatch, Australians lost over \$3 billion to scammers in 2022. During 2023, reported losses year to date are over \$367 million.


